For qualifying residential solar array systems less than 30 kW-DC and not to exceed 125% of the consumer's peak load:

- 1. Member should contact SEC, prior to the installation, to request all necessary documents to enter into a Net-Metering Agreement with the Co-op. <u>Member will need to provide (via phone or in-person) Co-op with an overview of the planned solar installation.</u> [Net Metering Agreement is pages 18 21 in the **Manual**.]
- Member will need to have the Solar Vendor fill out Application for Operation pages 30, 31 and 34 of the Manual and provide them back to the Member to include with their Net Metering Agreement.
- 3. For the purpose of a cost or ROI analysis, SEC currently has a \$24.50 monthly Customer Charge, and a Rate Rider of \$8.50 on all Net Metered accounts. A Net Metered billing account will have a monthly minimum of \$33.00. [SEC Rates are available at www.se-coop.com.]
- 4. Member or Solar Vendor **should not** operate or inter-connect to the distribution grid without a Permission to Operate (PTO) certificate. The certificate will be issued electronically after the Inter-Connect Inspection and new Net Meter has been provided by the Co-op.

For qualifying residential solar array systems greater than 30 kW-DC and less than 300 kW-DC and not to exceed 125% of the consumer's peak load:

- 5. Member should contact SEC to request all necessary documents to enter into a Net-Metering agreement with the Co-op. [Net Metering Agreement is pages 18 21 in the **Manual**.]
- Member will need to have the Solar Vendor fill out Application for Operations pages 30 thru 34
 of the Manual and provide them to them back to the Member to include with their Net
 Metering Agreement.
- 7. For the purpose of a cost or ROI analysis, SEC currently has a \$24.50 monthly Customer Charge, and a Rate Rider of \$8.50 on all Net Metered accounts. A Net Metered billing account will have a monthly minimum of \$33.00. [SEC Rates are available at www.se-coop.com.]
- 8. Member or Solar Vender **should not** operate or inter-connect to the distribution grid without a Permission to Operate (PTO) certificate. The certificate will be issued electronically after the Inter-Connect Inspection and new Net Meter has been provided by the Co-op.

For qualifying non-residential solar array systems less than 300 kW-DC and not to exceed 125% of the consumer's peak load: *Member must contact their SEC Member Services Department at (580) 745-9463.
